
## VINOUS OBSCURA **'CENSER' 100% SAGRANTINO**

## **OUICK SUMMARY:**

This wine is our 3rd commercial release of Sagrantino. These vines are an important part of our exotic vineyard in the Columbia Gorge AVA. Sagrantino is the thickest skinned wine grape in the world, with incredible tannins and resveratrol levels. Used for centuries as a 'sacramental' wine, this grape was brought back from obscurity in the 1970's by the hard work and vision from Arnoldo Caprai and his team. This traditional Umbrian grape is most famous in and around the city of Montefalco. Named after the religious incense burners, this wine exhibits incredible aromatics of frankincense and myrrh. Since our first vintage, this wine continues to impress. It is one of our strongest arguments for a wider view of Oregon wine. Bottled unfined (Vegan) and unfiltered.
